Religious Education

Intent

Our intent through our religious education curriculum, is to ensure our children are religiously literate and able to hold conversations about religion and belief.

Implementation

As a Church of England School we follow the Lincolnshire Religious Education Syllabus. The curriculum builds on prior learning, allowing children to make links and build upon their knowledge. The curriculum develops children's knowledge of and understanding of Christianity as well as other principal religions and world views, it reflects diversity in terms of the challenging religious landscape of the UK so that they are prepared for life in modern Britain. It reflects children's own experiences and provides a safe space for discussion, it takes into account the increase in the number of people with non-religious beliefs and identities, it provides an opportunity for personal reflection and spiritual development and it helps to prepare children for adult life, enabling them to develop respect and sensitivity for others.

To further enhance our RE curriculum we:

- Visit places of worship to allow our children to have real life experiences and link it to their learning.
- Have a learning environment that support religious education, as well as creating a safe space for children to have discussions.
- Invite members of the community in to support the teaching of RE, including, Mrs Small, the Bishops Visitor.
- Ensure children have access to a wide range of resources to support their learning.
- Ensure staff have regular CPD and have good connections with the Diocese to support the delivery of RE.

Impact

The children at Fiskerton CE Primary School can have respectful, informed conversations about the main world religions and beliefs. They are able to draw on prior learning and feel safe to discuss their thoughts and feelings. They are able to take opportunities for personal reflection and spiritual development, they are able to show respect and sensitivity to others.
